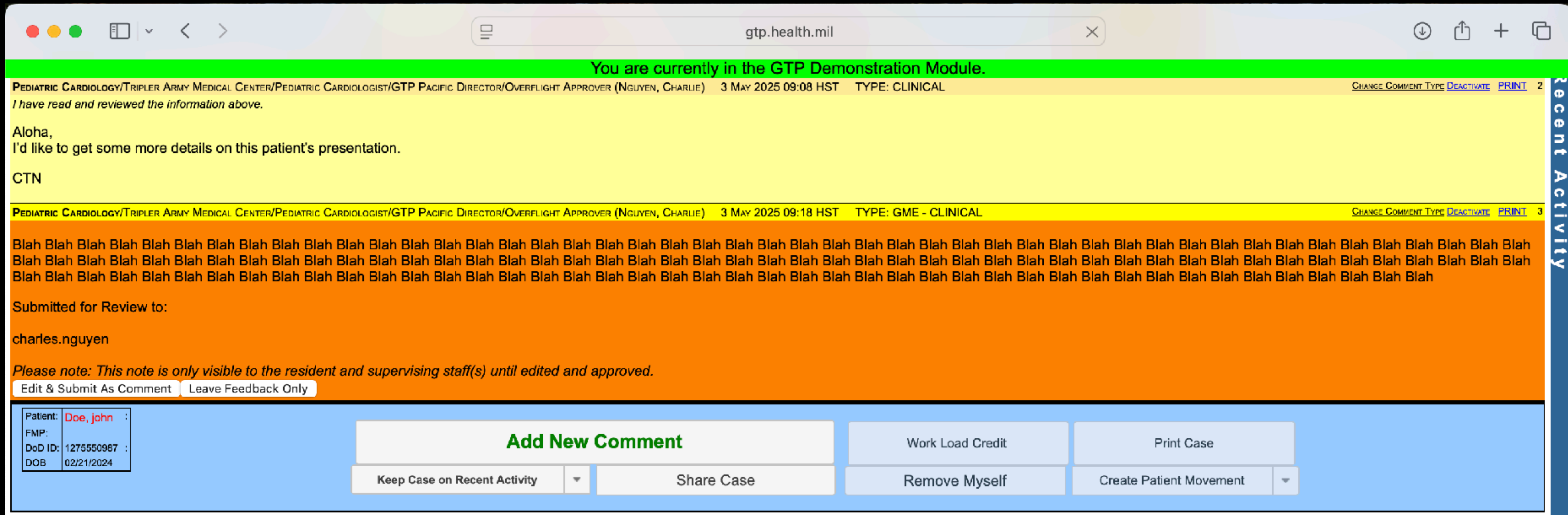

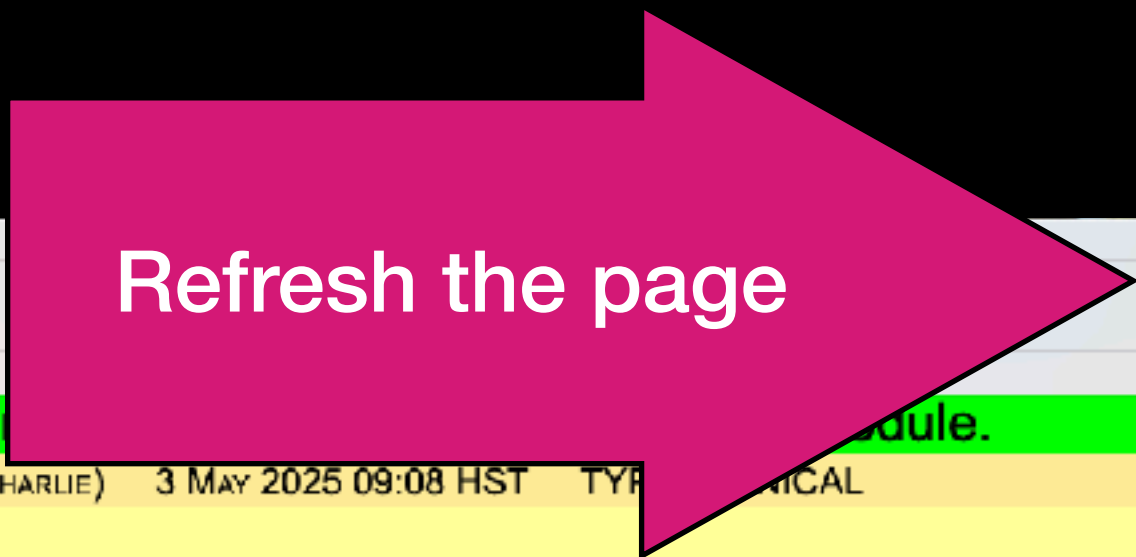

Create Patient Movement

Final Points:

1. Many of the cases on GTP are generated by junior providers who are 1-2 years out of training
2. As a result, many of the cases involve “bread and butter” topics that residents are likely to see after they graduate
3. Therefore, GTP is a legitimate source of case exposure for residents and helps to fulfill the ACGME requirements
4. Resident comments can take on a variety of forms:
 - Responding to the sending provider and simulating the role of the subspecialist
 - Asking questions to the assigned instructor (i.e., attending physician)
 - Posing thoughts or reflections on the case: *I always thought that the thyroid was a mythical organ.*
 - Posting and/or citing up-to-date literature on the topic pertinent to the case
 - Providing respectful critiques about how the consultation was presented
5. Residents should feel free to post anything they want as long as their comments are THOUGHTFUL AND RESPECTFUL
6. Resident comments and instructor feedback is NOT visible to the sending provider
7. So as instructors respond to resident comments, it will serve as a parallel line of communication dedicated to GME
8. Unlike other modes of teaching, this function also saves the comments and serves as proof that teaching/learning took place
